CANYON UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT COMMITMENT TO CLIMATE JUSTICE ACTION



WHEREAS, Canyon is a strong community that is proud to commit to actions for climate justice; and

WHEREAS, we believe it is important to advocate for climate action to curtail one of the greatest threats facing communities throughout the world; and,

WHEREAS, we believe that climate change is not a partisan nor political issue and that local, state, and national policies should be guided by the best available science; and,

WHEREAS, there is a broad scientific consensus among climate scientists that human activities, contributing to increases in greenhouse gas emissions, are the dominant cause of the climate crisis change; and,

WHEREAS, children represent a particularly vulnerable group because greenhouse gases emitted into the atmosphere will accumulate over the coming decades and will profoundly impact our current students throughout their lives, as well as the lives of future generations; and,

WHEREAS, the Canyon School District Board of Education recognizes that climate change is a social justice, generational, equity, and human rights issue. While climate change impacts *all* people and disproportionately impacts *all* young people and *all* further generations, it disproportionately affects people of color and people in poverty, thereby exacerbating existing inequalities and limiting equality of opportunity; and,

WHEREAS, the global impact, urgency, and magnitude of the challenge of addressing the climate crisis change calls for leadership in all sectors of society, all institutions, and all elected leaders; and,

WHEREAS, we work to ensure that all Canyon School District students graduate knowing they have a choice to be responsible stewards of the environment; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Canyon School District welcomes invitations to advocate alongside youth-led climate justice movement groups such as Earth Guardians and



Youth vs Apocalypse at the local, state, and federal levels.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Canyon School District encourages the strengthening of relationships for intergenerational collaboration for climate justice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Canyon School District celebrates existing district sustainability initiatives such as:

Reducing Waste	School lunch composting program, classroom recycling bins, and reusable dishware.
Sustainable Food Systems	The talented, loving, creative super home-cooking school chef who uses organic foods and school garden produce when possible.
Environmental Education and Curriculum	Teaching respect for trout spawning, the watershed, and the redwoods; environmental service learning projects and field trips; nature journaling; student choice advocacy letters; incorporating discussions about the youth-led movement for climate justice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Canyon School District calls on Congress to take swift and effective action for climate justice to protect current and future students.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Canyon School District Board shall support and promote discussions between Canyon school students, staff, parents and local communities regardingfurther action towards climate justice. Examples may or may not include:

- Offering educational opportunities to students and parents to explore climate justice issues and the impact of individual and community choices.
- Striving for a zero to low waste practice that minimizes plastics and packaging at school (assessing continued use of items such as plastic cups of fruit, Halloween carnival prizes, and packaged snacks).
- Striving towards an even more climate-friendly food service, including locally sourced food.
- Reviewing the carbon footprint impacts of the 8th-grade travel to Costa Rica.
- Exploring ways the community can support the request for CalSTRS to divest from fossil fuels.
- Promoting political action on a local, regional and national scale such as fracking, water quality, plastic pollution, extinction of species, melting of the polar ice cap, etc.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Canyon School District Board directs the district Superintendent/Principal or staff member to transmit copies of this resolution to the following: the Superintendent of Contra Costa County Schools, all California Superintendents of Schools, the California Teachers' Union, Canyon Education Foundation (CEF), Canyon Association to Support the School (CATSS), the State Superintendent of Education, the Congressional Climate Solutions Caucus, the California State School Board Association, the National School Board Association, all California members of Congress, and the Schools for Climate Action campaign.
