school administrators' association, and the state and National Association of School Psychologists) to pass climate action resolutions similar to ours, calling on Congress to enact climate policies to protect current and future student;

## NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

- 1. We celebrate Archer's effort to uphold sustainability at school such as the implantation of LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) equivalent in their construction plans, which include high-efficiency plumbing fixtures and climate-based irrigation controls, use of recycled water for irrigation, native vegetation for non-sports field areas, student-run garden, a stormwater retention system, All mechanical, electrical & plumbing fixtures for the New Academic center are both Cal-Green & Title 24 compliant, use of outdoor space to reduce air conditioning, and food preparation on campus using Culinart (a sustainability focused food service provider).
- We encourage our own student council officers, teachers, school board members, and superintendent to engage with local, state, and federal jurisdictions and elected leaders to engage in non-partisan advocacy for science-based policies to restore the climate;
- 3. We encourage our school administration and board of trustees to form a multi-stakeholder committee to develop a Climate Action Plan addressing these areas:
  - a. Buildings and Grounds
  - b. Operations and Food Service
  - c. Direct Greenhouse Gas Measurements and Goals for Net-Zero
  - d. Climate Literacy and Climate Advocacy in the Curriculum
  - e. Institutional Advocacy for Climate Action
- We direct our student council to transmit official copies of this resolution to Schools for Climate Action campaign, school administration, board of trustees, and member of Congress.
