Youth & Educator Climate Advocacy Summit Kids & Teachers Urge Congress to Act on Climate Change Before it is Too Late

Youth-adult teams representing school districts and student councils from across the country will hand-deliver climate action resolutions to all 535 Congressional Offices. These resolutions contain an urgent, nonpartisan message: *Congress has a moral imperative to act quickly and boldly on climate change to limit harm to students and future generations.*

In just over a year, climate action resolutions have been passed by more than 55 education organizations in 9 states. More student councils, school boards, and educational organizations are passing new resolutions each month. The resolutions frame climate change as a generational justice, human rights, equity, and children's issue and take Congress to task for their inaction.

The event expects hundreds of attendees with two youth participants for every adult. A press conference and panels that include members of Congress, national climate and children's welfare experts, youth advocates, and educators will be held. The event sponsors are <u>Schools for Climate Action</u> and <u>Young Voices for the Planet</u>.
